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Who Won Maine-NH Border War?



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Three Tie for 2012 Amateur Championship



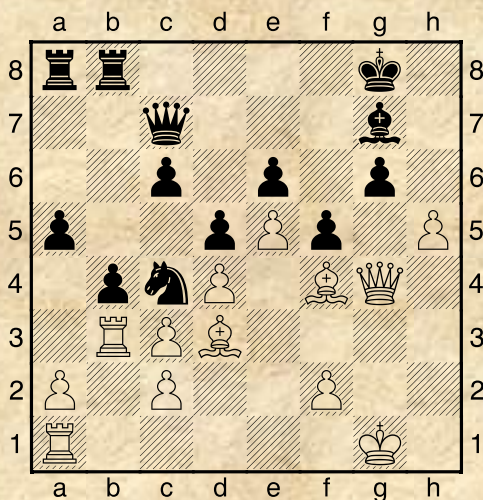
Three players shared the 2012 New Hampshire Amateur Championship, held on October 6, 2012 at the Comfort Inn in Manchester. Sharing the honors were Simon Rubenstein-Salzedo (below, far left), Gerald Potorski (far left), and Arthur Tang (below), all with three points. Topping the field overall was Matthew Fishbein of Maine, with a perfect 4.0 score. Only New Hampshire residents are eligible for the Championship title. Fishbein beat Siddarth Arun of Massachusetts in their final round showdown. The three winners did not meet head-to-head. Three New Hampshire

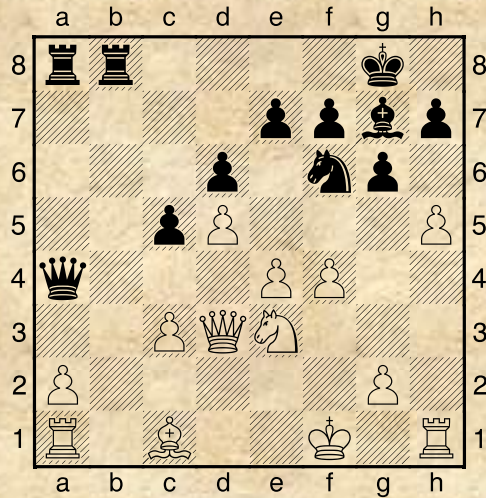
players also tied for the Intermediate Championship. Tom Laaman, James Hankard, and Lee Dailing all finished at 3.0, a full point behind Alvin Tan of Massachusetts, who beat Laaman in the last round. Ma, Chevalier Individual Scholastics Champs

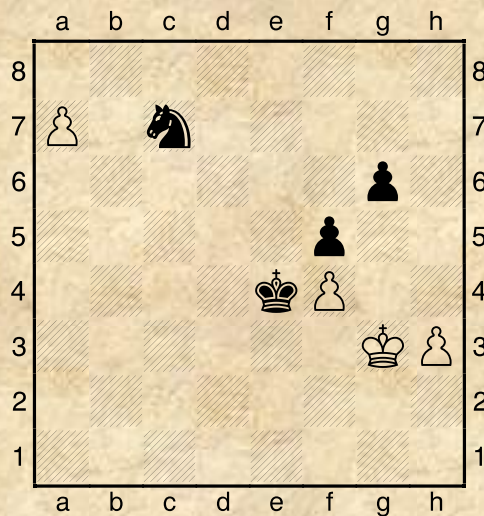

Grandmaster Alexander Ivanov led the field in the 2012 with seven points out of eight, followed by IM David Vogorito at 6.5 and Bournival at 6.0. Bournival upset Vigorito, while falling to Ivanov and drawing with NM Hal Terrie and U1600 winner Alex Franke. John Elmore parlayed a last round draw with Ivanov into the U2000 prize with 5.5/8, and Walter Whitmore, Robert Walton, and Alex Franke (propelled his draw with Bournival) each scored 4.5/8 to share the U1600 prize. 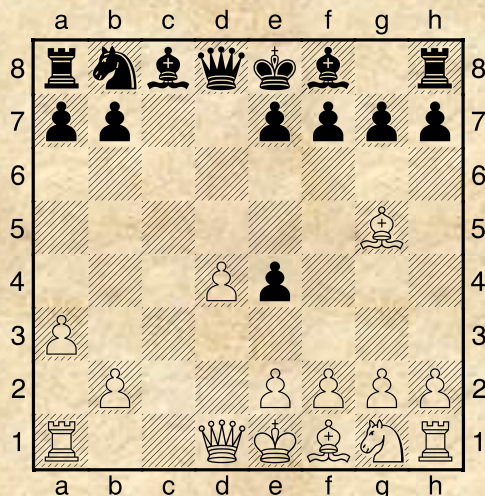
GM Eugene Perelshteyn bested the competition in the 36th Queen City Open, held in Manchester on February 25 and 26. Perelshteyn scored 3.5/4.0, drawing only with Steven Winer in Round 4. Winer tied with Brad Bournival, Joseph Fang, David Carter, and Tom Atkocaitis for third, all with 2.5 points. Albert French won the Under 35 Section, Ryan Sowa, the Under 1635 Section, and Fernando Emilio Ramierz the Under 1335 Section. Hal Terrie directed the field of seventy players. 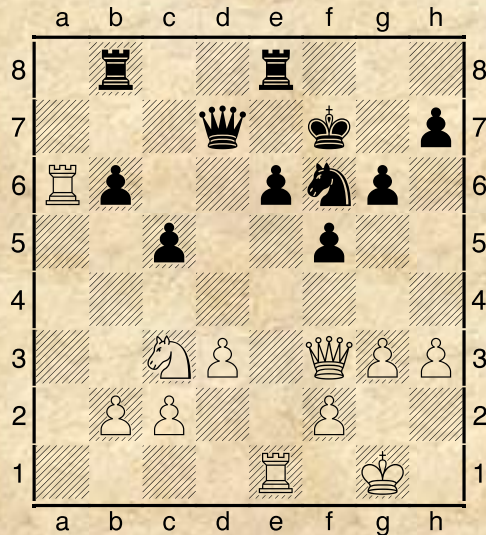
